Cedars of Lebanon State Park, Lebanon, TN, 30 miles east of Nashville.

LODGING

Group Lodge: Two big bunk rooms – one for night owls, one for early birds. Bunks are not pre-assigned and rooms are not gender specific (bathrooms and showers are). Bring bedding, towels and earplugs.

Camping: RV and tent camping are available. Call the Cedars of Lebanon park office at 615-443-2769 to reserve your spot.

Local Motels: Lebanon, TN, 7 miles north of the park, has several motels. EconoLodge and Holiday Inn Express & Suites are nearby.

Cabins: There are just 8 cabins available and many who want them, so we hold a drawing to level the playing field. A cabin sleeps 5, Thurs/ Fri/Sat nights. Kitchens have cookware and linens. Postmark deadline for entry is January 11, 2023. We email results to applicants soon after the drawing on January 16; if you don't initially get a cabin, we can either tear up your \$675 check or put you on a waiting list.

2023 PRESENTERS & PERFORMERS

Joseph Decosimo

A national Old-Time banjo champion and prize-winning fiddler. Joseph Decosimo is regarded as a deeply knowledgable and powerful performer and teacher. He performs in The Bucking Mules and the Blue Ridge Broadcasters. Based in Durham, NC, Joseph has served on the faculty of East Tennessee State's Bluegrass. Old-Time, and Country Music program, and holds a PhD in American Studies and in MA in Folklore from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Luke & Lisa Richardson

Luke Richardson is another member of The Bucking Mules, fluent in fiddle, banjo, and harmonica. Luke's banjo chops have earned him two National Old Time Banjo Championships. His fiddling, ace harmonica playing, and singing bring texture and range into performances. Luke is bringing his talented wife **Lisa** who is also highly skilled in old time fiddle, banjo, and guitar to assist with workshops and performances.

Bob Townsend

Bob Townsend is considered one of Tennessee's finest living fiddlers and an expert on regional repertoires and styles of the South Cumberland area. As part of the Tennessee Traditional Arts Apprenticeship Program, Bob is teaching students the tunes and techniques he learned from local fiddlers in Marion, Grundy, and Franklin counties.

Kelsey Wells

Kelsey Wells plays multiple instruments and is best known as half of the popular contra dance band. Turnip the Beet. and for creating and operating "crankies." The 2012 Uncle Dave Macon Days Traditional Fiddle Champ, Kelsey plays fiddle, banjo, cello, and more, often dancing while she plays.
