LOCATION

Cedars of Lebanon State Park, Lebanon, TN, 30 miles east of Nashville.

LODGING

Group Lodge: Two big bunk rooms – one for night owls, one for early birds. Bunks are not pre-assigned and rooms are not gender specific (bathrooms and showers are). Bring bedding, towels and earplugs.

Camping: Very limited camping spot remain as the park is renovating 2 of the 3 camping areas. Call the Cedars of Lebanon park office at 615-443-2769 to reserve your spot. Consider the Group Lodge as an option this year.

Local Motels: Lebanon, TN, 7 miles north of the park, has several motels. EconoLodge and Holiday Inn Express & Suites are nearby.

Cabins: There are just 8 cabins available and many who want them, so we hold a drawing to level the playing field. A cabin sleeps 5, Thurs/ Fri/Sat nights. Kitchens have cookware and linens. Postmark deadline for entry is January 12, 2024. We email results to applicants soon after the drawing on January 22; if you don't initially get a cabin, we can either tear up your \$695 check or put you on a waiting list.

IMPORTANT: We require entrant's registration (mail-in or online) for the full weekend before a cabin entry is considered valid.

2024 PRESENTERS & PERFORMERS

Earl White Stringband

Fiddling Earl White has been a mainstay in the old-time, folk and dance community for more than 50 years. An original and founding member of the famed Green Grass Cloggers, he is one of few Black Americans preserving and playing Appalachian oldtime string band music, which was once an intricate part of Black communities and formed the foundation for much of American music of today. He has delighted audiences from Common Ground On The Hill, to the Scotland National Folk Festival, and many other festivals and camps throughout the US. Earl White is well known for his extensive repertoire of tunes, and his heartfelt, syncopated, driving style. His mentors have been Tommy Jarrell, Judy Hymen (Horseflies) and Andy Williams (Plank Road String band), to name a few. He has played in numerous Oldtime stringbands, and currently leads the "Earl White Stringband", featuring Victor Furtado (banjo), Mark Olitsky (banjo) Adrienne Davis (guitar), and roving bass players to include Joe DeJarnette (bass).

Roadside Distraction

Gretchen Priest-May is founder, & director of the Musical Heritage Center, (aka Fiddle & Pick) and teaches old-time, Irish, bluegrass fiddle and other styles through private lessons, classes and hosts inclusive traditional music jams/ sessions. She recently released a new record, "Roadside Distraction," with mandolinist **Emily Wilson** (Old-time, Irish & wacky modern tunes), and guitarist extraordinaire, Tim May. She also currently plays her long-time band, PLAIDGRASS. She has been on staff at many music camps, toured with Ceili Rain, Crucial Smith, played the Grand Ole Opry, and for many Nashville artists.

Wax Cylinder Recordings

Martin Fisher has been collecting early recordings and recording devices since childhood. He will demonstrate and record music on wax cylinders on Friday at 1:30pm, an annual treat at BUW. You'll find him at the Nature Center.
